## Rationale

- *behaviour difficulties*
- *less support at home*
- *troubled families*
- *poor attendance and punctuality*
- *weak language and communication skills*
- *movement between schools (forces children and LAC)*
- *inconsistent parenting*

The challenges are varied and often there are individual issues.

Our culture here at Pinewood believes in ALL children and that there are no excuses for underperformance. All staff know who the disadvantaged and vulnerable children are.

Underachievement is tackled at all levels and children's individual needs are carefully considered to support everyone to do their very best.

We will;

- Continue to improve teaching and learning on a daily basis through high expectations and the whole community to believe excellence as standard here at Pinewood
- be consistent, share good practice, assess regularly and address any underperformance
- Improve attendance and late arrivals
- Offer early mornings and after school learning
- Provide earlier intervention
- Provide individualised support
- Provide support for parents AfA
- Employ more TAs to support learning in the classroom
- Run High Attainers booster maths sessions
- Computer Club for High Attainers
- TA to deliver Kinesiology methods for children with poor coordination and balance
